# Winter Newsletter October 2018



### On Friday, April 13, 2018, members of NMB AALAS spanning from

Massachusetts, Vermont, Canada and New Hampshire, joined together at the scenic site of Middlebury College who graciously hosted our Spring gathering. We enjoyed three wonderful speakers starting with Dr. Michael Dash, Assistant Professor of Psychology who spoke on *Sleep: The Price we Pay for Learning.* Dr. Dash uses the rat as a model to study brain neurons. There are 87 billion neurons in the human brain. He looks at neuroplasticity and the pros and cons of connections that are not fixed. He spoke of necessity of sleep as well as what neurons are doing during sleep and talked of a drug called ZIP, an inhibitory peptide, that wipes out memory in rats permanently, although they can re-learn. Could ZIP be an effective drug for people suffering from Post-traumatic Stress Syndrome?





### We then broke for lunch in a room with a view of the Vermont

mountains, enjoying soup and sandwiches. During lunch we discussed changes in membership

for vendors, QUAD donations for the auction as well as location for Fall meeting of 2018. Additionally we entertained the idea of a Facebook page and communications by means of Facebook. Currently as I write this letter we are working on planning the Fall 2018 meeting for later in November in the area of Burlington VT.

Following lunch we returned for two more speakers beginning with Dr. Clarissa Parker Assistant Professor of Psychology & Neuroscience. Her topic was titled: *Mouse Models in Substance Abuse Research*. She works on identifying genes associated with ethanol sensitivity and their implications for human alcohol use disorders. Many people in society today drink for many different reasons ranging from social, celebratory, relaxation or stress relief. Consumption of alcohol in moderation can have benefits, however it is highly addictive and is the most damaging drug to individuals and society. Risk of developing an alcohol disorder may be linked to genetics. Her research involves experiments with normal mice versus those treated with ethanol. Ethanol consumption reduces the body temperature making it more sensitive to hypothermia.






Our Final speaker of the day was Shelia Cameron, Director of Organizational Development






